Directions to petitioner

2. on a notice board outside the church or in some other prominent position (whether on the outside of the church door or elsewhere) so that it can be read by the public.

The Committee recommends the works or proposals for approval by the court [subject to the following provisos]:

1. The location and fixing of all internal power cables and power units must be agreed on site with the Inspecting Architect, in order to ensure that they are as inconspicuous as possible, with minimum damage to fabric.
2. The electrical installation must comply with BS7671 – 2008 Requirements for Electrical Installations (IEE Wiring Regulations 17th Edition) and the best practice set out in the Council for the Care of Churches booklet 'Wiring of Churches' ISBN 0-7151-7571-8 (1997).

This advice does not constitute authority for carrying out the works or proposals and a faculty is required.

In the opinion of the Committee rule 9.9 of the Faculty Jurisdiction Rules (publication of notice on diocesan or other publicly accessible website) does not apply.
