Holy Communion (with children's group & crèche)

We are welcomed, and then stand to sing: Name of all majesty (A&M 736)

Through Christ let us offer our sacrifice of praise to God.

Let our lips proclaim his praise.

We say sorry to God and are reminded of his great forgiveness:

God of mercy, we acknowledge that we are all sinners.

**We turn from the wrong that we have thought and said and done,
and are mindful of all that we have failed to do.**

**For the sake of Jesus, who died for us,
forgive us for all that is past, and help us to live each day
in the light of Christ our Lord. Amen.**

We listen to God's Word: Luke 10:38-42 (Red pew bibles p1042)

After each reading This is the Word of the Lord **Thanks be to God**

Before the children go to their group, a thought, and then we sing:

Stop what you're doing and pray to Jesus (x3) - Mighty, mighty Jesus

1. When you're laughing... pray to Jesus

When you're crying... pray to Jesus

When you're bored... pray to Jesus: Mighty, mighty Jesus

Big big, good good, mighty mighty Jesus (x3) - Mighty, mighty Jesus

2. When you're noisy... pray to Jesus

When you're cranky... pray to Jesus

When you're naughty... pray to Jesus: Mighty mighty Jesus

Big big, good good, mighty mighty Jesus (x3) - Mighty, mighty Jesus

3. When you're hurting... pray to Jesus

When you're frightened... pray to Jesus

When you're sleepy... pray to Jesus: Mighty, mighty Jesus

Stop what you're doing and pray to Jesus (x3) - Mighty, mighty Jesus

We turn to God in prayer: Lord in your mercy **Hear our prayer**

We listen to God's Word: Ephesians 6:1-9

(p1177)

We hear God's Word preached: Sermon by Hubert

We stand to affirm our faith in Jesus Christ the Son of God:

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**



**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen**

We sing God's praise: All for Jesus, all for Jesus

We sit as we remember and celebrate all Jesus has done to give us life:

The Lord is here.

His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is right to praise you,
Father, Lord of all creation;
in your love you made us for yourself.
When we turned away you did not reject us,
but came to meet us in your Son.

**You embraced us as your children
and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.**

In Christ you shared our life
that we might live in him and he in us.

**He opened his arms of love upon the cross
and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.**



On the night he was betrayed, at supper with his friends
he took bread, and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to them, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

**Father, we do this in remembrance of him:
his body is the bread of life.**

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine,
he gave you thanks, and said:
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins;
do this in remembrance of me.

**Father, we do this in remembrance of him:
his blood is shed for all.**

As we proclaim his death and celebrate his rising in glory,
send your Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine
may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.

**As we eat and drink these holy gifts
make us one in Christ, our risen Lord.**

With your whole Church throughout the world
we offer you this sacrifice of praise
and lift our voice to join the eternal song of heaven:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

**Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come, your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen**


We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

We sing God's praise: Come, thou fount of every blessing (A&M 618)

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.
In the name of Christ. Amen
